# Audition Information - Fall 2025 AUDITION DEADLINE: Monday, August 11, 2025, at 4:30 p.m. Updated May 22, 2025 (subject to change)

Special note: Dr. Culligan is on sabbatical 2025–2026. Please consult the Interim Director of Orchestras for any questions.

The Philharmonic Orchestra is **open to strings, woodwinds, brass, and percussion.** ALL students should submit an entrance/placement audition with the below marked excerpts. **Please register for the NKU Philharmonic course PRIOR to submitting an audition.** You may always drop the course later, depending on the audition results.

- Please video record yourself playing your specific excerpt. Please note the piece and tempo marking. It is highly recommended that you listen to a recording!
- Upload your video to YouTube as an unlisted video
- Submit you **YouTube link** via the below online form. All videos must be a YouTube link AND submitted within the online form.

# **VIOLA**

- One scale of choice (number of octaves and articulation is up to the performer) please introduce what you will be playing in your video
- Beethoven, Symphony No. 7, movement I, 4 before Letter G through Letter H



# **CELLO**

- One scale of choice (number of octaves and articulation is up to the performer) please introduce what you will be playing in your video
- Beethoven, Symphony No. 7, movement I, Letter H to 22 after Letter I



# **DOUBLE BASS**

- One scale of choice (number of octaves and articulation is up to the performer) please introduce what you will be playing in your video
- Beethoven, Symphony No. 7, movement I, Letter H to 22 after Letter I

# **WOODWINDS**

#### FLUTE

- One scale of choice (number of octaves and articulation is up to the performer) please introduce what you will be playing in your video
- Beethoven Symphony No. 7, movement 1, mm. 63–88



# OBOE

- One scale of choice (number of octaves and articulation is up to the performer) please introduce what you will be playing in your video
- Beethoven, Symphony No. 7, movement I



#### **BASSOON**

- One scale of choice (number of octaves and articulation is up to the performer) please introduce what you will be playing in your video
- Beethoven, Symphony No. 7, movement II, 1 measure before Letter G to Letter H




#### **CLARINET**

- One scale of choice (number of octaves and articulation is up to the performer) please introduce what you will be playing in your video
- Borodin, Polovtsian Dances



# **BASS CLARINET**


- One scale of choice (number of octaves and articulation is up to the performer) please introduce what you will be playing in your video

# **BRASS**


#### **HORN**

- One scale of choice (number of octaves and articulation is up to the performer) please introduce what you will be playing in your video
- Beethoven, Symphony No. 7, movement I, 2 before C to C (Note: The below is written for horn in A, but you may play it at written pitch on a horn in F if you are not yet comfortable with transposition)



# **TRUMPET**

• One Scale of choice (number of octaves and articulation is up to the performer) – please introduce what you will be playing in your video Stravinsky, Petrouchka (1947 version), Waltz, Box 149 to Box 151 (Excerpt is for Bb trumpet)



# **TROMBONE**

- One scale of choice (number of octaves and articulation is up to the performer) please introduce what you will be playing in your video
- Borodin, *Polovtsian Dances*, No. 17, 8 before D to D
- Rimsky-Korsakov, Russian Easter Festival, Letter B to 4 before C





#### **BASS TROMBONE**

- One scale of choice (number of octaves and articulation is up to the performer) please introduce what you will be playing in your video
- Rimsky-Korsakov, Capriccio Espagnole, mvt V



#### **TUBA**

- One scale of choice (number of octaves and articulation is up to the performer) please introduce what you will be playing in your video
- Berlioz, Symphonie Fantastique, mvt 4


Keyboard appointments to Philharmonic are via applied instructor recommendation.
