What's Happening in the MPA Program?

New MPA Diversity Scholarship

The NKU MPA program has a new Diversity Scholarship, which is designed for students with a demonstrated commitment to enhancing the understanding and appreciation of diverse populations. The program plans to award the first scholarship of \$1,000 in Fall 2016.

Applicants must be new MPA students who have been fully admitted (not conditionally or provisionally) and write an essay detailing activities in which they will engage to promote diversity on campus and/or in the broader community. Preference will be given to students from underrepresented populations in the MPA program.

Summer Study Abroad in Austria

MPA students have a new opportunity to study management and leadership in Austria during five weeks in the Summer. Based in the city of Bregenz, the program is led by Dr. Jeff Zimmerman, an organizational leadership professor at NKU.



This year, the Austria-Bregenz program will run from late May to late June, and the cost is about \$5,800, which includes tuition for 6 credit hours, airfare, lodging, two meals a day, and a 10-day Eurail Pass. Students may be eligible for a \$2,000 International Study Scholarship from NKU. <u>Click here</u> to learn more.

Dr. Misis to teach online terrorism class this Summer

Terrorist threats and actions by groups like the Islamic State continue to raise fear and concern in the United States and around the world. This Summer, Dr. Marcos Misis will teach Terrorism (PAD 683), which will focus on jihadist groups in the United States, in a completely online format from July 11 through August 13.



Current graduate students can register for PAD 683 without submitting a new application. Interested individuals who are not graduate students must apply as a non-degree-seeking student and submit official transcripts from any universities they have attended.

Dr. Misis, who regularly teaches in the MPA program, has conducted research on citizens' fears and police officers' views of terrorism. Here's an <u>interview</u> with him on local <u>public radio station WVXU</u>.

MPA/ASPA dinner featured People's Liberty CEO

The annual MPA/ASPA dinner took place on Tuesday, February 23. Eric Avner, CEO of People's Liberty, talked about this five-year initiative that grants funding to individuals who have "big ideas" to transform the region. This approach of granting funds to individuals, or social entrepreneurs, is in contrast to the traditional approach by most foundations of granting funds to nonprofit organizations.



A flagship program of People's Liberty is the Haile Fellowship, which is a \$100,000 grant awarded to two individuals each year who have identified major challenges in the region and potential strategies for addressing them. The fellows also receive 12 months of space at People's Liberty, which is located in the historic Globe Furniture building near Findlay Market in Over-the-Rhine, as well as assistance with marketing and outreach.

The dinner was co-hosted by the NKU MPA program and the Greater Cincinnati Chapter of the American Society for Public Administration (ASPA), which is the largest professional association for managers in public and nonprofit organizations.

Fall Reception speaker focused on sexual orientation in public environments

About 50 MPA students, alumni and faculty attended the MPA Fall Reception on October 22. They networked, socialized and heard from Bonnie Meyer, Director of NKU's LGBTQ Programs and Services.



NKU was the first university in Kentucky to create an LGBTQ office to increase awareness of and advocacy for students, staff and faculty. Bonnie shared her experiences as the first director in developing policies, programs and services. In addition, she discussed recent events related to sexual orientation in our broader society, particularly the U.S. Supreme Court decision to recognize same-sex marriages.

It also featured planned developments for 2016, including a Kroger Marketplace, three new restaurants, a number of new elementary schools, and a housing complex for low- and moderate-income seniors.

Local government scholarship awarded to Elizabeth Ruwe

Congratulations to MPA student <u>Elizabeth Ruwe</u>! The Northern Kentucky City and County Management Association (NKCCMA) selected Elizabeth for this year's local government scholarship. Elizabeth currently serves as Community Engagement Manager with the Girl Scouts of Western Ohio. In this role, she



leads about 100 volunteers and identifies opportunities for community partnerships. This is the second year that the NKCCMA has awarded this scholarship, which is designated for students in the NKU MPA program interested in local government management or public service. Lisa Watkins's Capstone project leads to \$40,000 grant \ldots and media attention

For her Capstone project in Spring 2015, <u>Lisa Marie Watkins</u> (MPA 2015) researched best practices in grassroots public health programs and co-authored a grant application for the Healthy Homes program at Santa Maria Community Services. The Robert Wood Johnson Foundation – the largest public health foundation in the country – awarded a \$40,000 grant to the program this summer.
